#### **Greendale PAC**

**Meeting** - Our next PAC meeting is Wednesday, March 10th at 7:00 pm via zoom. We would love to see you there! As a parent of a student at Greendale, you are automatically a member of our Parent Advisory Council (PAC) and we welcome your support and involvement as we work together at making our school a better place. When you attend a PAC meeting, you will also hear first-hand from our principal, Mr. Sharman, about upcoming events.

Fruit & Veggie Program – The first week of March students will get an opportunity to snack on Royal Gala Apples through the BC School Fruit and Veggie Program (https://www.bcaitc.ca/bc-school-fruit-vegetable-nutritional-program). Each month the produce is prepped by a PAC volunteer and delivered to each classroom, usually before recess. Students have access to the produce throughout the day, depending on individual classroom guidelines. Ask your child or their teacher how this works for them!
