Parent Volunteers and Visitor Information

We kindly ask that all parents and visitors enter through the main front doors when coming to the school. Please do not enter through any side doors or classroom doors.

All visitors MUST be wearing a mask before entering the school, sign-in at the office, and sanitize hands. All volunteers will be required to follow the Health and Safety Protocols set out by the Ministry of Education.
