- -PAC Café was not well-attended, despite people requesting this type of event
- -Some parents at other schools were unhappy with the lack of communication regarding FSA testing we received an email from Brad, so at Greendale, we didn't have that concern
- -School Boundary Review and LFI proposed move to Slesse. Going to board for initial approval in January. From February-April, there will be opportunities for parents and staff to weigh in. Stay Tuned!
- -BCCPAC is pushing for new members! Join all of the PACs across BC. Fun conferences to attend annually and have a voice in what is going on in schools even outside of our district.
- -Survey regarding the Logo, Mission, Values, Purpose of DPAC closed on Nov. 13<sup>th</sup> (it was shared on our facebook page by Meagan)
- -DPAC asked how school PACs are finding the communication to parents many expressed difficulties similar to what we have discussed. Fewer families are using Facebook, so we are making sure to use email more this year. Some PACs use separate apps like "Slack" with success. Something to look into?
- -DPAC asked to check in with our school regarding the Feeding Futures food program. The consensus is that it is going well at Greendale and is well-utilized, but we aren't feeling the need to supplement financially. However, Bowls of Hope does

help supplement lunch. Currently we have about half a dozen kids receiving breakfast each day and about a dozen kids for lunch.
