Boundary changes proposed:

- Making Imagine High grades 6-12 and removing IAT (Integrated Arts and Technology) from AD Rundle
- Moving locations of French programs (Cheam/CMS EFI to the new school and VMS LFI to Slesse)

Dec 16 at 5:30pm – Meeting put on by the district for parents (or potential parents) of VMS (poorly timed with not much notice (Dec 4<sup>th</sup>))

-speaking of which, parents are really upset with the district this year and how they have handled changes...the family of schools decision and timing was also very poorly done and upset a lot of people! The wording of this email was bad, too –“this is one option we are considering”...what are the other options, shouldn't we be able to know those too? Unless there aren't any other options...

-fairly well attended with about 30 parents

-Amy Dhanjal and Dave Manuel were present

-Katie Bartel, DPAC President, was also present

-tables had chart paper and noted concerns and questions

Jan 7 – DPAC put on a virtual meeting for parents to attend

Jan 27 is the School Board Meeting (parents can attend and some will be allowed to speak for 2 minutes each)

Concerns that arose from the meetings:

- With this change being proposed for Sept 2027, this would affect the current grade 6 students for their grade 8 year (and current grade 4 students of Greendale). Worth mentioning that these kids were in Kindergarten for COVID (though they are resilient, their school journeys have already been bumpy) Parents don't want their child to have to move to a new school for grade 8, only to have to transition again the following year to Sardis – aren't Transitions and student well-being a huge part of the strategic plan? This feels like a numbers game, not thinking about the kids involved at all.
- The French program has been well-established (resources) at VMS for over 30 years – the whole culture of the school and prioritizing the French language and culture cannot just be plucked from one school and placed in another. Programs, such as band, are heavily populated by French kids at VMS (band teacher was in attendance for the DPAC meeting and confirmed that the majority of her band groups are made up of French kids and her program would suffer this loss)
- The teachers would literally lose their jobs and have to reapply, which is ridiculous. Also, how do they feel about moving schools?! Not to mention, how would the Slesse staff feel? Pushed out? Slesse is not empty – there are portables...we predict that French classes would likely get a "hallway" and potentially displace teachers from their established classrooms and into portables. Will the English teachers feel upset by this and blame the French program? That would not set the school culture off to a good start
- Splitting kids from friends – Connections between LFI and English kids at Slesse would be separated from each other (one of the concerns parents have about Stitos right now too!)

Alternative ideas?

- Since the goal is to increase the number of students going to SS (as opposed to GW), they are "double-dipping" by moving the LFI kids. They will get to fill VMS with English kids that will go to SS AND the LFI kids will still go to SS. The best counter-idea I have heard throughout these meetings is, why not have all of Slesse go to SS. Years ago, that was the track they followed. And SS is actually closer/more convenient for Slesse parents too, I would think.
- I suggested this at both meetings I attended and NO ONE had considered that option before – it took a group of parents one hour to find an alternative. I only hope they take this into serious consideration. From what I see, there are a lot of parents very invested in stopping this from happening!
